Delivering Ultrafast Broadband to Churcham Business Park



Wytech Case Study

The client

Located three miles from the city of Gloucester, Churcham Business Park is a purpose-built lightindustrial business estate which offers a unique and contemporary blend of industrial and office space in attractive rural surroundings. Initially established in 2004, the park is now home to 38 tenants and more than 200 employees. The seven-acre site comprises 38 individual units, from 300 sq ft to 5,500 sq ft, with state-of-the-art facilities and dedicated on-site car parking.



It is owned by leading local property farming business Smart Farms, run by brothers David and Peter Smart.

The challenge

Wytech was appointed to design, supply and install an innovative new broadband connectivity solution at Churcham Business Park and provide an ongoing, fully managed delivery and support service.

When it was opened in 2004, the

park had a broadband solution in place that was adequate for its needs at that time. However, with the advent of the cloud, social media and ecommerce, business demand for faster download speeds increased exponentially and the park's existing broadband connectivity and infrastructure was struggling to cope. This put Churcham at a competitive disadvantage when compared to in-town rented business premises, which could offer better connectivity.

The park urgently required a solution which would not only meet current tenant demand for highspeed broadband connectivity but was also futureproof and able to evolve with advances in technology. This would, in turn, enable the park to compete on a more level playing field with more urban business locations.

The solution

In order to provide the high-speed and futureproof connectivity the park required, Wytech designed project managed and implementation of a Gigabit leased line solution that delivered fibre-tothe-premise (FTTP) connectivity to every business unit on the site. This means that the Gigabit backbone and the links to each of the park's 38 units are both fibre rather than traditional copper cable. Two







wireless links were also set up to connect to adjacent farms owned by Smart Farms, that are located away from the main business park.

Wytech's engineers utilised existing ducting on the site to run approximately 3.5km of fibre-optic cable to the business units, from the main communications cabinet into a Wytech-supplied, gigabitcapable router in each unit. This gives each unit a dedicated connection with quaranteed upload and download speeds of 30, 50, 100Mbps and faster, depending on their needs, along with a static IP address and support via Wytech's dedicated helpdesk.

The impact

For Churcham Business Park to remain competitive, it was critical that it could offer broadband speeds that could match those offered by business locations in more urban areas. Wytech delivered an easily managed, resilient, feature-rich, highly scalable and futureproof connectivity solution which is adaptable to suit the growing needs and capabilities of the park.



It means that tenants and the business itself now have access to download and upload speeds of up to a gigabit, compared with the 2.5Mbps it had prior to the solution being installed.


These considerable benefits were combined with the design, procurement and complete lifecycle delivery offered by Wytech, and the high levels of personalised customer service and technical expertise that Wytech has built its reputation on.


Grant funding

Funding for the solution was provided by the Marches and Gloucestershire Broadband Grant (MGBG) scheme, part of the Fastershire partnership between Herefordshire, Gloucestershire, Shropshire and Telford

& Wrekin Councils which aims to bring faster broadband to businesses across the four counties. Fastershire is designed to help small and medium size businesses get the most from fibre broadband and be more competitive. It aims to help to boost the local economy by £420m over the next ten years.

The MGBG scheme provides a bespoke solution for any eligible small to medium sized business that still require access to faster broadband and are currently not planned to be connected by existing contracts or commercial plans. Part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), individual businesses can access a grant of up to 100% of the capital installation cost of a project, up to £25,000 in value. However, in this case, several of the businesses located at Churcham Business Park came together to submit a 'combined solution', which not only meant the solution could serve all the businesses on the site, but they were able to access a bigger grant from the scheme by pooling their resources.




